



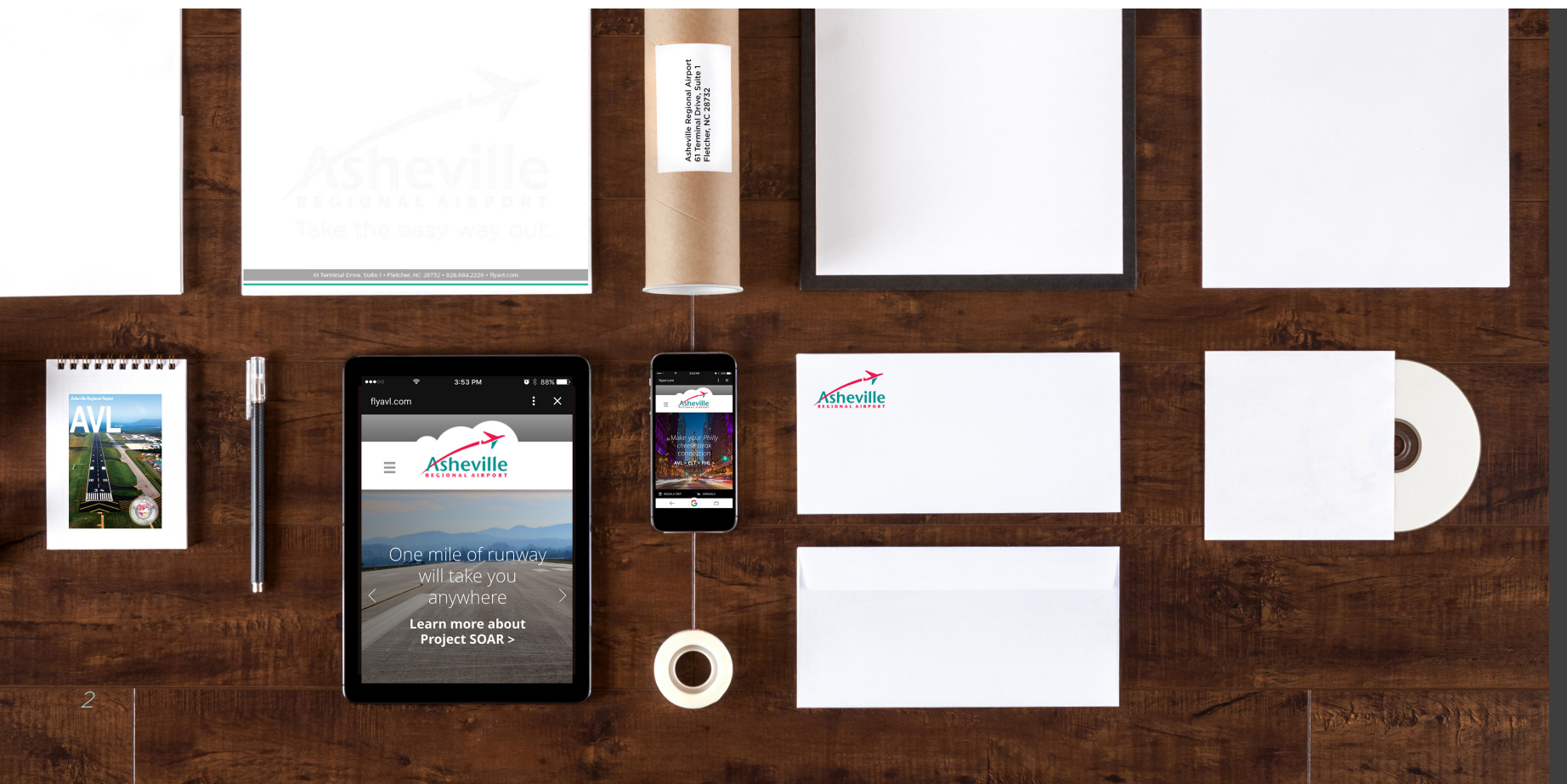

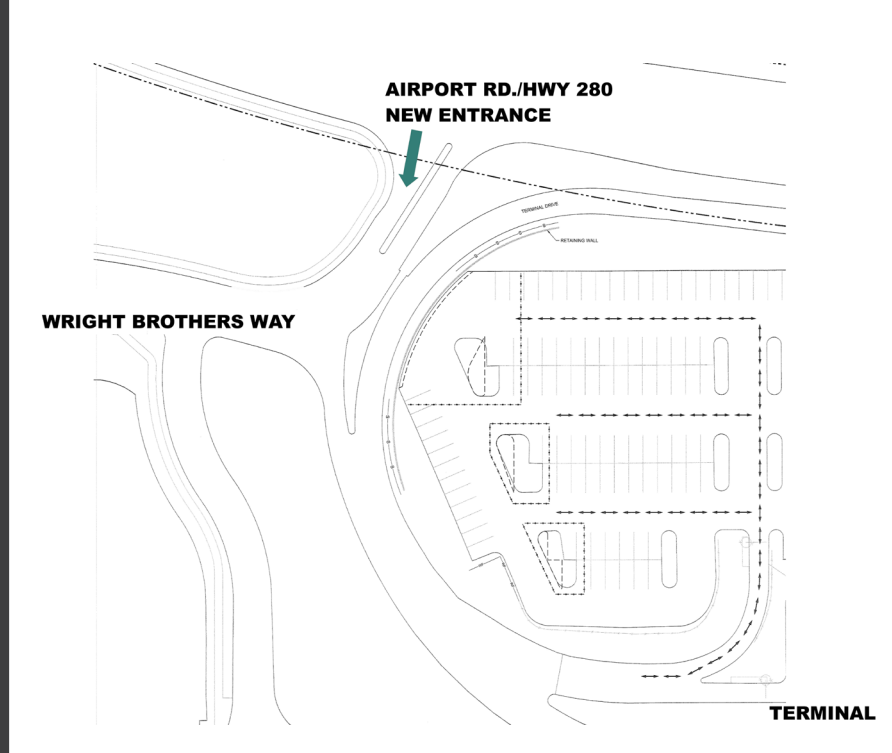
Allegiant, the ultra-low cost carrier servicing Asheville Regional Airport, established AVL as a base of operations on September 1, 2015. The base favorably positioned AVL for future growth. Allegiant based two planes at the airport, crews, and a maintenance facility, providing 40+ new jobs in the region to accommodate the base. The community of western North Carolina has embraced Allegiant. Throughout 2015, Allegiant offered non-stop flights to five Florida destinations; Orlando, St. Petersburg, Ft. Lauderdale, Puta Gorda, and Palm Beach. Allegiant increased the number and frequency of flights to their Florida destinations during 2015.

NEW entrance — Main entrance completed and opened.

NEW digital entrance sign — In April 2015, the new entrance sign made its debut. It is a focal point of the new main entrance. The new sign boasts an LED display, on both sides, that advertises different airport happenings and other information. The completion of the new sign was an exciting addition to the face of the airport. It is the first thing that greets AVL travelers and those passing by. It also stands as a tangible part of all the monumental things happening at AVL from another record breaking year to Project SOAR.

MORE parking — AVL opened an additional long term credit card parking lot to help manage the increase of passenger vehicles in 2015.

Project SOAR advancement — The 4-Phase | 5-Year airfield redevelopment project, Project SOAR, is the most significant construction project since the airport was built and opened in 1961. It was a big year for Project SOAR in 2015, with the completion of Phase I early in the year, along with beginning and completing Phase II of the project.

HELLO — (temporary) RUNWAY 17/35

On December 10, 2015, temporary runway 17/35 (future permanent taxiway), was commissioned. The commissioning was right on schedule, meeting a project deadline set two years in advance.

GOODBYE — RUNWAY 16/34

2015 marked the final year of operation for runway 16/34 at AVL. The runway was permanently decommissioned, as part of Phase II of Project SOAR, on December 10, 2015.

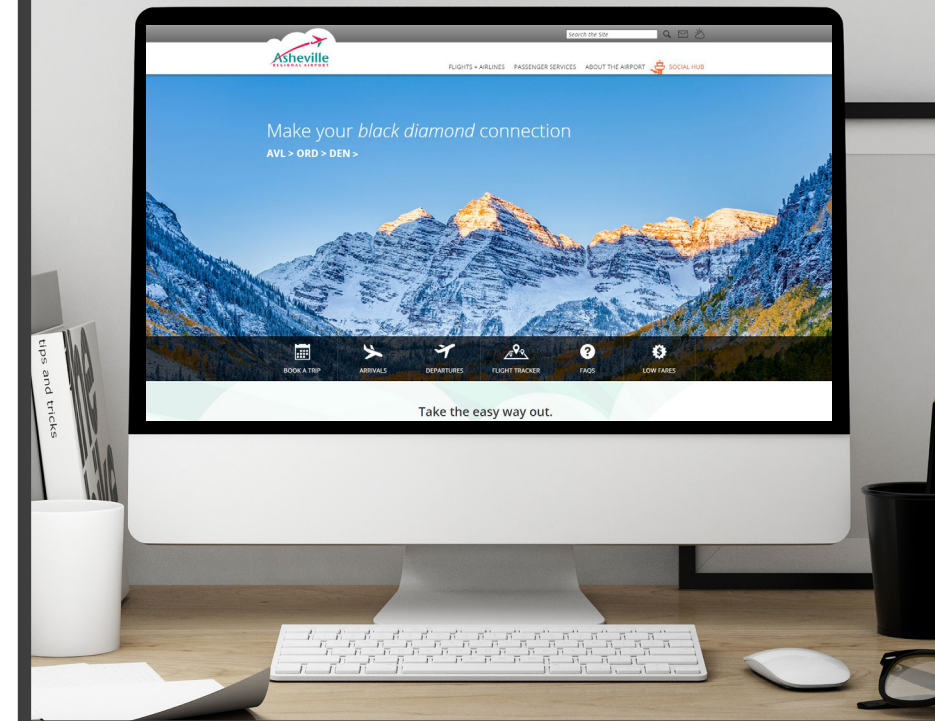

SAFETY training —

The airport hosted a region-wide disaster drill in May 2015, using the National Incident Management System (NIMS). The disaster drill allowed NIMS-certified airport employees and regional emergency workers to implement their FEMA training in a mock crisis.

OPERATION MEDICINE DROP event —

In an effort to provide a safe, secure way for residents of western North Carolina to dispose of potentially dangerous expired, unused or unwanted prescription medications, Asheville Regional Airport Department of Public Safety and the Partnership for Substance Free Students in Buncombe County hosted a drop-off event in September, 2015. The event was a success and received the highest number of drop-offs, in one day, in Buncombe County.

a snapshot of the fiscal year (ending June 30, 2015)

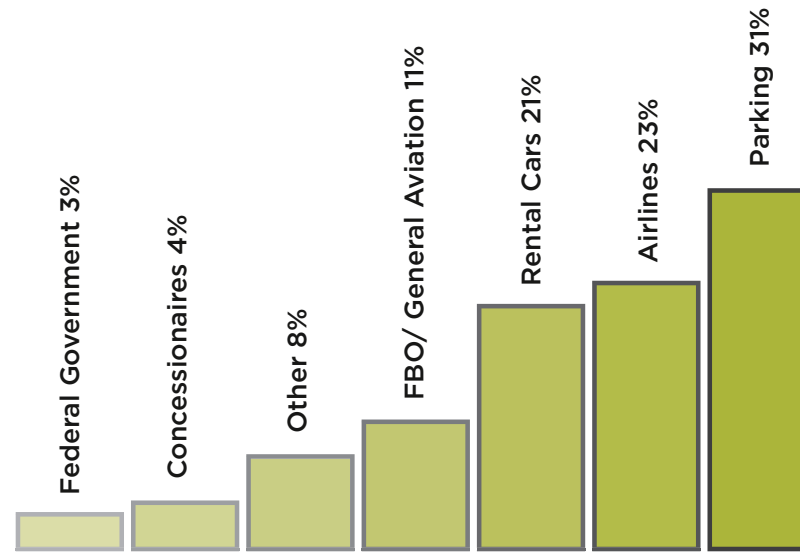


The Authority's assets exceeded liabilities by \$98,207,986 at June 30, 2015.
