Asheville Regional Airport continued to grow in 2014, breaking records and embarking on significant infrastructure development projects. The growth is a reflection of the vibrancy and strength of the western North Carolina region.



756,425 total passengers served, making the 2014 calendar year AVL's busiest year in history, breaking the previous record set in 2010.

Air Service - By the Numbers



May 2014, Allegiant added Palm Beach (PBI) as their **5th** non-stop Florida Destination from AVL.

Allegiant grew to **24%** of passengers served at AVL in 2014 and is on track to provide 30% of seats in the market by Summer 2015.






