Airport construction update

Make-ready work for upcoming construction:

Trees have been removed along Airport Road near the I-26 South Exit 40 entrance ramp. This is a portion of the airport property that is being prepared for use during some upcoming construction. Specifically, this area is where our contractors will stage equipment and supplies needed for the next 3-4 years as we embark upon a project to expand and modernize the airport terminal (more details coming soon).

The airport has limited land available that is suitable for this use, and by removing the trees now and preparing the area, we can provide a nearby staging area for construction. Once our terminal project is complete, that land will become available for future development per our land development plan.

New Cell Phone Lot under construction:

Directly across the street from the Shuttle Lot, you now can see construction work underway on our new Cell Phone Lot. We expect this lot to be complete and in use this summer. We will communicate here, with local news media and on our website when the lot officially opens.
