CONSTRUCTION CONTINUES TO MOVE AVL FORWARD





Progress on AVL's new terminal and air traffic control tower are still full speed ahead, as we continue to work hard for our region's future. Here is a quick highlight of progress:

- North Concourse: Glass installation and rough-in (initial installation of wiring, plumbing, duct work etc.) is currently in progress. The temporary dry-in (weatherizing and protecting the interior from the elements) is scheduled for the end of November.
- Baggage Handling System: the conveyor installation is in progress.
- Air Traffic Control Tower: The tower precast and cab steel installation is continuing. The Base Building is progressing with rough-ins and wall framing.


Interview with AVL's President + CEO
