A message from the President & CEO

Thank you for taking a few moments to read my message regarding some important things happening at Asheville Regional Airport. I'm going to address three topics: our fast-growing utilization, parking constraints, and TURO hosts and users at the airport.

The good news: Asheville Regional Airport has more nonstop flights than ever before, and our region's residents are using the flights. We fully expect to end this year with the highest number of annual passengers in our history. We have advocated for years to bring excellent air service to WNC, and we thank you for flying from AVL.

The unexpected: the pace of growth has exceeded all projections. We work with industry consultants to conduct sophisticated growth projections to aid our facility and operational planning. The momentum of growth in our area, both from local fliers and visitors, has quickly exceeded projections.

The growing pains: We are on track and on point with medium-term infrastructure growth plans (we will share detailed information soon about the terminal expansion starting in 2023). But we also have more pressing needs that have arisen because of the explosive growth: specifically, customer parking has been a focus.

I am proud of the airport team for moving through the many steps necessary to construct and open our new Shuttle Lot last year, and our new overflow lot that opened this week. These two lots have added about 600 additional parking spaces for our customers. It should be noted that infrastructure development does not happen quickly in an airport environment due to many regulated steps, and the team pushed the projects forward well.

Next year, we will open an additional remote lot south of the terminal, with about 500 more spaces.

TURO: This topic may not apply to many of you, but we hope those who need to know will pay attention. The key takeaways: TURO may not operate at the airport at this time, and passengers who have rented a car through TURO need to be aware that TURO cars on airport property are subject to towing.

TURO is a peer-to-peer car rental service, much like the private vacation rental home industry, but for personal vehicles. TURO is operating in western North Carolina, with local residents using the platform to rent their personal vehicles.

Unfortunately, TURO (corporate) has refused to comply with airport operating rules and regulations for peer-to-peer rentals, so currently, it is illegal for TURO transactions to occur on airport property.

We realize that local TURO hosts may not quite understand this restriction, which is why I am including this topic today. Any person or organization that wants to do business on-site at the airport must be permitted, according to our rules and regulations, or be under a lease or operating agreement. This applies to all businesses operating at the airport, such as airlines, restaurants, car rental services, all ground transportation companies and peer-to-peer operators. **Operating agreements and permits create a level playing field for all, and the airport does not provide advantage to one provider over another.**

TURO has refused to comply, so we are forced to ban all TURO operations at the airport at this time. This means that TURO vehicles are subject to towing from airport property, and owners can be issued citations or injunctions.

We are not privy to local TURO hosts' contact information, so we asked leaders at TURO to communicate this information with all of their hosts in our area. We don't know if this outreach has occurred, so we are using this platform to try to get the word out.

I encourage our local TURO hosts to reach out directly to TURO to encourage them to sign the operating agreement (as they have at many other airports) so you can legally operate at AVL. We would welcome you here, and hope you understand that we are required to ensure that all businesses are operating legally and fairly at the airport.

That's all for today. I will commit to communicating more frequently with updates about our local airport, and I thank you very much for flying from AVL. There are great things coming, and we'll get there together.

Good news — we've added more space for you with an additional overflow lot that opened this week, providing hundreds more parking spaces for travelers. This lot is served by our airport shuttle to and from the front curb and is open when the main lots are full.

Plan extra time to get to the airport, just in case your preferred lot is full. All you need to do is enter the Daily Lot, drive to the toll booth at the parking lot exit and obtain a permit and directions to the overflow lot. (Watch for LOT FULL signs with these instructions.)
