THE CHANGE WILL BE ASTRONOMICAL

And it's all about MORE SPACE for you!



Just one month after breaking ground on the biggest infrastructure project in our history, significant changes can already be seen. Construction is in full force at AVL, and if you have traveled recently, you have seen the impacts first-hand. Here's what you need to know:

- 1. **Our north concourse is GONE!** Demolition of the old north concourse is complete, and Hensel Phelps, our construction management company, is hard at work building a new north concourse from the ground-up. This portion of our AVL Forward project will take about 18 months to complete, and we will keep you updated along the way.
- 2. The central energy plant is undergoing significant interior finishing, as well as some final exterior civil work. This free-standing building can be seen as you enter the airport on Terminal Drive, on the right immediately before you arrive at the airport terminal. The







building will house equipment that will provide utilities, such as heating and cooling, for the new airport terminal.

- 3. Site work is continuing just south of the terminal (near baggage claim). What's happening here? We are placing some modular buildings in this area that will be used as tenant offices, so we can vacate areas of the terminal for demolition. We expect to have the modular buildings in place and ready to occupy late this year.
- 4. The passenger experience: once you head to your gate, you will see that we are using a modular building as a temporary gate area. Additionally, all boarding and deplaning happens outside using portable ramps and a covered walkway to and from the terminal. Rest assured, these are temporary measures, necessary due to our major construction project.

PARKING UPDATE

MOBILE PAY NOW AVAILABLE

Overflow parking is now easier for you

We continually work to improve the passenger experience, and we have a parking improvement that we want you to know about. Beginning in early October, we are implementing LazGo in our parking lots A, B and C – the overflow parking lots we open when our main lots become full. LazGo is an easy payment system for you, so when our main lots are full, follow these steps:

- 1. Follow airport signs to lot A, B or C
- 2. Choose an open parking space
- 3. Look for blue "PAY HERE" signs in the lot with instructions about how to use your mobile device and credit card to prepay for parking before your trip; then pay for your trip
- 4. Show your parking receipt (sent to you on your mobile device) to the shuttle driver, who will drive you to the front curb of the airport

OCTOBER WILL BE A BUSY MONTH AT AVL

Be a savvy traveler

Did you know that October is traditionally one of the top two busiest travel months at Asheville Regional Airport every year? If you are planning to fly to or from AVL this month, we want you to be ready for peak travel conditions.

- 1. **Arrive two hours before your flight BOARDS.** This time is listed on your flight's boarding pass and is generally about 30-40 minutes prior to your flight's departure. Arriving this early gives you ample time to park, check-in at the ticket counter, check a bag if you need to, go through security screening (even if you are flagged for additional screening), grab a snack, and make it to your gate with ease.
- 2. **Be aware that lines may be long.** There are times when hundreds of travelers will be arriving at the airport at the same time, checking in for flights and going through security. Pack your patience and realize that everyone in line will get checked in and screened (as long as you have arrived within the airline's check-in timeframe double check your itinerary).
- 3. You may be able to bypass the airline ticket counter. Many travelers don't need to check in at the ticket counter. If you are not checking a bag, you can most likely check-in on-line or in your airline's app and download a digital boarding pass. Visit your airline's website or download your airline's app and follow check-in instructions. (Note: you can check-in starting 24 hours prior to your flight.)
- 4. **Make sure you pack smart.** Visit tsa.gov to learn more about what you can and can't pack in your carry-on or checked luggage.


