


Advocacy in action

Lew Bleiweis, President and CEO of the Greater Asheville Regional Airport Authority, has been visiting with elected officials to highlight our airport's infrastructure needs.

Recently, AVL was awarded several discretionary grants as part of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL), totaling \$35 million (\$25 million for use toward a new air traffic control tower, and \$10 million toward a new airport terminal).

Senator Thom Tillis was a part of negotiating and passing the BIL and spent some time this month learning about the airport's plans. From his twitter account: "I'm proud to have helped direct millions in federal funding, from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law I helped negotiate and pass into law, to support expansion efforts."

FIREARM IN YOUR CARRYON?

Be prepared for a criminal citation

Asheville Regional Airport's Department of Public Safety (AVL DPS) has updated its enforcement practices when firearms are brought to security screening at the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) checkpoint. Any person found with a firearm at the checkpoint will be criminally cited in addition to possible civil penalties assessed by the TSA.

FROM NORTH TO SOUTH

Construction updates


North: Trees have been removed along the north edge of the airport property, visible from I-26 and Exit 40. These trees were interfering with Federal Aviation Administration radar, which posed a potential safety issue; therefore, they have been removed.

East: Steel has gone up, and the new central energy plant is taking shape. This building will eventually house all HVAC equipment for the airport terminal.

West: Prep work for the new air traffic control tower is underway. Contractors are preparing their facilities and conducting site work. We will share photos when more progress has occurred.

South: Land is being cleared south of the airport along Hwy 280 across from the WNC Ag Center in preparation for a new remote parking lot, estimated for completion later this year.
